



Alternate Work Schedule for Alaskan Regional Office

Regional Office employees are beginning the new year under Alternate Work Schedule (AWS) Programs. Alternate work schedules have been found to be an extremely useful tool which can enhance efficiency, promote program goals, and enrich the quality of work life.

The issue of alternate work schedules was initially raised by the Regional Office Human Relations Committee (HRC), who requested the Regional Management Team (RMT) to consider this option.

The efforts to bring AWS on line began with a survey to all supervisors and employees to ascertain interest; the response was overwhelmingly in favor of AWS. During interviews, RMT members expressed confidence that AWS would work for the regional office. Increased employee morale and productivity were cited as two of the primary reasons for their support. Surveys of other Federal agencies using AWS found that the programs functioned effectively with management and employees being

extremely pleased with the benefits derived through AWS in their workplaces.

Based on this information, the RMT agreed to go forward with a proposal for a three-option AWS program. The Alaskan Regional Office program offers nonbargaining unit employees three options: a flexible gliding schedule and two compressed schedules. After approval by Headquarters, the Regional Office began the move toward a January 13, 1991, implementation date.


In addition to the program for employees in the Regional Office, an AWS has been available to bargaining unit employees covered by PASS in all Airway Facilities Divisions agency wide. This nationally negotiated program offers employees two forms of compressed work schedules.

Both supervisors and employees are optimistic about alternate work schedules. Both groups believe these programs will enhance the quality of life, both professionally and personally, for employees in the Alaskan Regional Office.



Alaskans Honored with Ai

The Associate Administrator for Airway Facilities, **Arnold Aquilano**, presents Key Awards for Excellence to show his appreciation to those employees who perform above and beyond their expected duties.

Five Alaskan Region people received these awards in December. **Robie Strickland**, Manager of Airway Facilities Division, presented the awards.



Howard Cleveland, AAL-462, is the regional representative for the establishment of the Maintenance Control Centers (MCC). The Alaskan Region was designated as lead Region for this program. Cleveland developed operational procedures and design for the MCC that are the basis for agency-wide implementation. The establishment of the MCC in Alaska has contributed to a more efficient and reliable Air Traffic Control System.

Forrest Barber, NA AFS, assumed the position of MCC Manager for the NA AFS in April 1990. At that time, the MCC was a vague concept, with only a couple of prototype MCC operating FAA wide. Barber worked vigorously at both the regional and national level to develop and implement an MCC operation in the Alaskan Region. He was also a driving force to implement MCC operations system wide. The Fairbanks MCC operation has now grown to a fully staffed and 24-hour operational MCC unit.

Through his efforts the Alaskan Region became the second Region to assume full VORTAC monitor and control at the MCC's.





vay Facilities Key Awards

Cathy Benediktsson, AAL-465, assumed control over the Regional Hazardous Material Program that had no national direction. She developed procedures for handling of hazardous materials that have been the basis for agency-wide implementation. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation consider the FAA Alaskan Region to be an aggressive organization in the cleanup and abatement of hazardous material.





Earl J. Hiett, AAL-453. When Arnie Acquilano, AAF-I, recently visited the Alaskan Region and toured the ZAN facility, he commented that the E-Desk (the combined air traffic supervisory control station and airway facilites maintenance control center) project was one of the best that he had seen in the FAA. Hiett was instrumental in coordinating and constructing this critical facility, not only with no disruption of service, but with a quality that was noted by the Associate Administrator of Airway Facilties

Hiett coordinated and accomplished moving the NARACS (emergency radio communication system) antenna at ZAN in essentially one long work day when many in the Region thought that FAA should accomplish the move with a specialized contractor.

Fay Lauver, AAL-422. Under her guidance, the Alaskan Region Airway Facilities Division has consistently far exceeded the goal of allocating the operations allowance within 1% without exceeding the allotment. This past year we came within 0.031% (\$16,000 out of a \$50,000,000+ budget).

Additionally, her leadership has been highly instrumental in again exceeding the Minority Business Enterprise goal - this year by 42%. Her skills, knowledge, loyalty, and dedication to the FAA are an inspiration to all who have the pleasure to work with her.





Abstract of the Flight Crew News article "ATC Controller at Anchorage Airport"

"Here in Anchorage, JAL's passenger service to Europe via the Polar routes which lasted for 32 years was suspended this past October. Anchorage station will assume a key roll for cargo transportation in the future.

Regardless of the changes of flow of people and freight, ATC should never change its function in air traffic. In Anchorage, various type aircraft from small aircraft to B747 and

small airports, such as Lake Hood and Campbell Lake Air Strip in vicinity of the International Airport, makes traffic flow complicated, leading to high tension for ATC controllers, especially those in the Tower.

Among all the controllers of these hard jobs in Anchorage, 17% are female. All controllers happened to be female in the Tower on the day of the interview.

Susan is a chief controller of 13 years experience and is an exact Airwoman who flies at least once a week in a small airplane. She has this job because she loves airplanes and flying.

'Asian pilots are generally cooperative to controllers in comparison to the US pilots.' Her rather quiet and low tone of speaking impressed us as being very credible and professional."






